What is SkillsUSA?

SkillsUSA is a national nonprofit organization. It is a partnership of students, teachers and industry working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce. SkillsUSA serves middle school, high school and college students in programs preparing them for technical, skilled, and service careers. In addition to technical skills training, SkillsUSA provides educational experiences for students in leadership, teamwork, citizenship, and character development.

Mission:

SkillsUSA empowers its members to become world-class workers, leaders, and responsible American citizens. SkillsUSA improves the quality of our nation's future skilled workforce through the development of personal, workplace and technical skills grounded in academics.

History:

SkillsUSA was founded as Vocational Industrial Clubs of America

(Vica) in 1965. In 2004, the name officially changed to SkillsUSA. Since 1965, the organization has served more than 14.6 million members. In Nebraska, more than 42,000 members have participated since 1967.



The philosophy of the Championships is to reward students for excellence, to involve industry in directly evaluating student performance and to keep training relevant to employers' needs. The state championships showcase the best career and technical students in Nebraska. First-place winners compete in the SkillsUSA national championships in Atlanta, Georgia.
